

FROM THE PRIEST

When I hear vines in Sacred Scripture, I'm always reminded of this Gospel passage!

This image is important because the land of Israel had tons of vineyards and had much religious imagery as well (Isaiah 5:7) (Jeremiah 2:21).

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus calls Himself the true vine. Why? Because no one can grow morally or spiritually unless they are rooted in God and in His Word!

One must be rooted in the "Tree of Life" who is God the Father and His Son, Jesus Christ! Jesus is the real source of life, that makes us grow in living in the life God has for us! It's only through Jesus Christ that anyone can be rooted in the vineyard of the Lord!

But how do vines become fruitful? By their branches! There are vines that can bear fruit and there are those that don't, and those that don't must be pruned! Jesus uses this imagery to show the kind of life He provides for those who are united with Him! The fruit that He bears for us is the Holy Spirit!





St. Mary Dashboard

In our ongoing effort at transparency, the Finance Council has adopted a "dashboard" to monitor not only current positions compared with previous periods, but also projections with regard to year-end financial positions.

The section labeled "Statement of Financial Position" is an overview of the parish Balance Sheet, showing a comparison to Last Year as well as any changes. As you can see, there is a significant positive change in parish assets due to the merger of Corpus Christi and St. Ladislas with St. Mary.

The section labeled "Parish Projection of Financial Activity 2023-2024" summarizes current Profit & Loss (P&L) activity and also provides an informed projection of revenue and expenses for the remainder of the fiscal year and displays any variance to budget plan. In contrast to the balance sheet, you will note that the anticipated net (deficit) to operations is significantly greater than the budget. As a reminder, when Corpus Christi and St. Ladislas merged with St. Mary, St. Mary inherited not only the assets but the liabilities as well. While some of the expenses related to the maintenance of all three buildings were anticipated in the budget, not all of them were foreseen. Additionally, you hopefully have noticed the substantial increase in parish membership and Mass attendance, and the many new and expanded ministries that are being offered. All of these blessings come with associated costs, many of which were not anticipated in the budget.

The dashboard also provides a few other statistics in graphic form for easier digestion and analysis.

A word about depreciation: When an organization purchases large items or assets, their loss in value is spread over a longer period rather than in one lump sum. This not only allows for a more accurate view of its value but also allows an organization to plan for its eventual replacement. On the dashboard you will see a large figure for depreciation; this is the annual amount taken to account for the restoration of the church building, as well as other items acquired over the years. While it is not cash – that is, we have paid off the church building so there are no more cash transactions on this asset – it is important that we as a parish collect enough money each year to cover depreciation and the costs of replacement and restoration.

The Finance Council reviews this data regularly; if you have questions or would like additional information, please contact the parish office or one of the members of the council.





REMAIN IN


Reflection on John 15:1-8

Within John the Evangelist's compelling image of the Church as "vine and branches," we hear Jesus say these words to us today: "Remain in me, as I remain in you." Recently, I have begun praying with and reflecting on these simple words many times throughout each day.

What does it mean to "remain in...?" Primarily and foundationally, it means that the Risen One, the Christ, is within each of us at all times, places, situations. This recalls the promise of Jesus at the end of Matthew's Gospel: "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28: 20). This is, in a sense, the second incarnation; the Word taking on flesh in Jesus of Nazareth is the first, and the Christ taking up residence in each one of us the second.

For us to remain in the Christ, there is some pruning that must take place. Gardeners know that plants respond to losing branches by putting more energy forth to regrow. Pruning our lives of the clutter of attachments, possessions, harmful attitudes and behaviors, allows the grace of God to be at work in us so that we can bear beautiful fruit for God and His Kingdom.

Pope Pius XII instituted the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker in 1955. This feast extends the long relationship between Joseph and the cause of workers in both Catholic faith and devotion. Beginning in the Book of Genesis, the dignity of human work has long been celebrated as a participation in the creative work of God. By work, humankind both fulfills the command found in Genesis to care for the earth (Gn 2:15) and to be productive in their labors. Saint Joseph, the carpenter and foster father of Jesus, is but one example of the holiness of human labor.

Jesus, too, was a carpenter. He learned the trade from Saint Joseph and spent his early adult years working side-by-side in Joseph's carpentry shop before leaving to pursue his ministry as preacher and healer. Pope John Paul II stated: "the Church considers it her task always to call attention to the dignity and rights of those who work, to condemn situations in which that dignity and those rights are violated, and to help to guide [social] changes so as to ensure authentic progress by man and society."

Saint Joseph is held up as a model of such work. Pius XII emphasized this when he said, "The spirit flows to you and to all men from the heart of the God-man, Savior of the world, but certainly, no worker was ever more completely and profoundly penetrated by it than the foster father of Jesus, who lived with Him in closest intimacy and community of family life and work."

In 1870, Pope Pius IX declared Saint Joseph the patron of the universal Church. In 1955, Pope Pius XII added the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker. This silent saint, who was given the noble task of caring and watching over the Virgin Mary and Jesus, now cares for and watches over the Church and models for all the dignity of human work.


