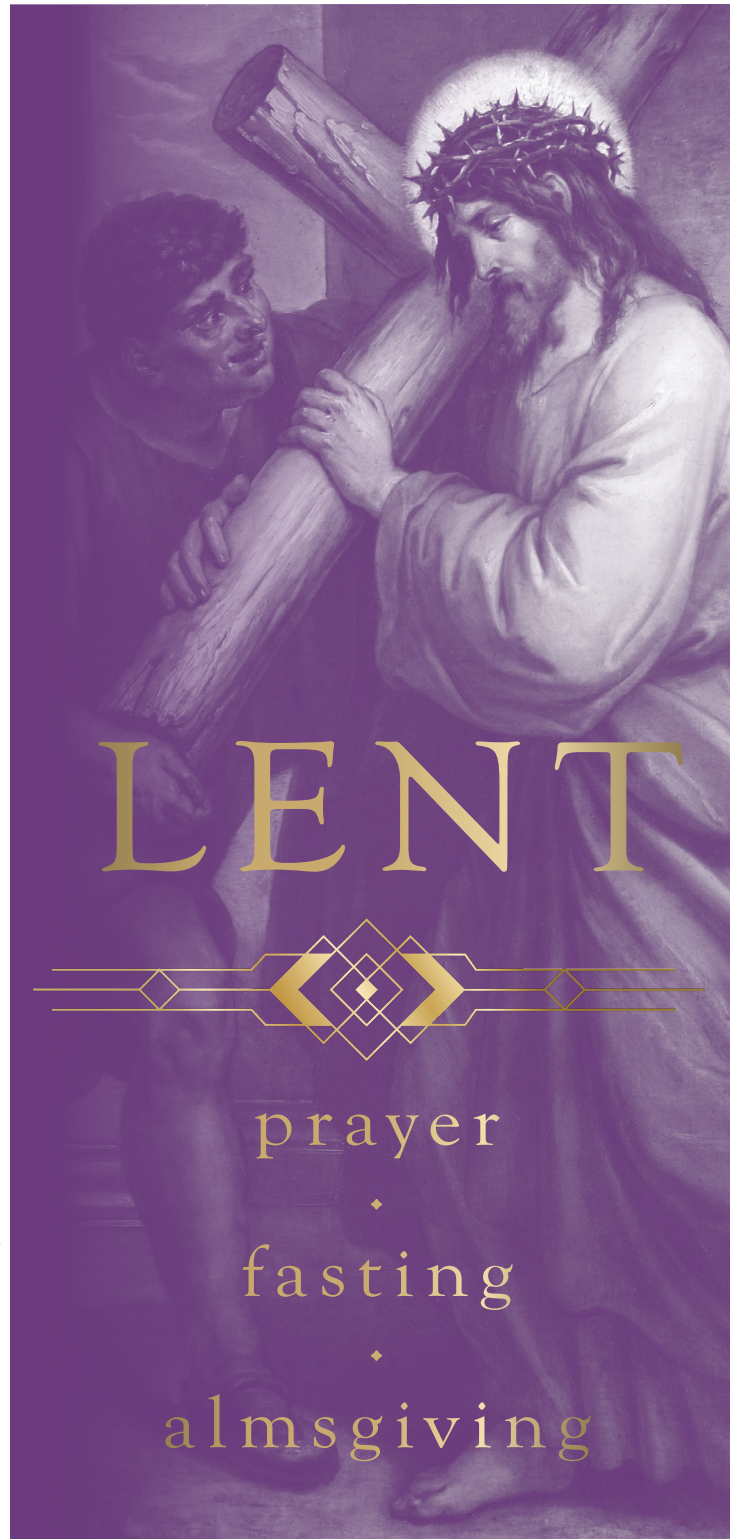

FROM THE PRIEST

J.M.J.

We are now well into the Lenten season as we celebrate the 4th Sunday. How is your Lent going so far? If great, then great! If in need of a reset, then let's recommit today to making Lent fruitful the rest of the season; there is still plenty of time!

In today's readings, we reflect on God's divine presence in our personal lives. God is personal. We see this in his dialogue with Samuel, in Samuel's dialogue with Jesse, and in choosing David to be The Anointed One.

What does it mean to be anointed? It means to be set apart by God for a specific task or purpose. Those who receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders and Anointing of the Sick, are anointed, set apart, as followers of Christ, to be conformed to Christ.

The first reading teaches us that God does not see as man sees; that God does not choose by appearance outwardly, but rather by what He sees inwardly in the heart. It reminds me of the old saying, "Do not judge a book by its cover." We are reminded that God always makes the right choice, and that He doesn't need much to work with. The Lord chooses one of the most unlikely, unqualified candidates in David. It is through the Davidic (Kingly) lineage that Jesus will be born into humanity, which represents His royal kingship.

In the second reading, St. Paul reminds us that Christ is The Light of the World, and that we are called out of darkness into this most wonderful light, as children of light. During the first part of the Easter Vigil, it will be dark both outside and in the church. Once the Easter Candle is blessed and lit, it will cut through the darkness. Then, as we process in, that light will be shared among the faithful present holding their own candles. As the light spreads, even though it is still dark, all the lit candles provide enough light that we can see.

As we make our way through the Easter Vigil readings and prepare for the Gospel, the Alleluia is sung for the first time and all the lights are turned on in the church, representing The Light of Christ in the world. It is a powerful moment in the liturgy, which represents the darkness of sin and death being conquered by the Light of Christ. May that light be kept burning brightly in our lives.

The Good news in the Gospel is that Jesus washes away our sins and its effects. The healing of the blind man represents how sin and darkness make us blind and how Jesus brings light and life and allows us to see. We see not just with our eyes, but with our minds and hearts as well. Thank you, Jesus!

St. Mary, Mother of God, pray for us.

DEL SACERDOTE

Ya estamos en plena Cuaresma, celebrando el cuarto domingo. ¿Cómo va tu Cuaresma hasta ahora? ¡Si va genial, genial! Si necesitas un cambio de rumbo, comprometámonos hoy a que la Cuaresma sea fructífera el resto del tiempo; ¡aún hay tiempo de sobra!

En las lecturas de hoy reflexionamos sobre la presencia divina de Dios en nuestra vida personal. Dios es personal. Lo vemos en su diálogo con Samuel, en el diálogo de Samuel con Jesé y en la elección de David para ser el ungido.

¿Qué significa ser ungido? Significa ser apartado por Dios para una tarea o propósito específico. Quienes reciben los sacramentos del Bautismo, la Confirmación, el Orden Sacerdotal y la Unción de los enfermos son ungidos, apartados, como seguidores de Cristo, para ser conformados a Él.

La primera lectura nos enseña que Dios no ve como ve el hombre; que Dios no elige por la apariencia exterior, sino por lo que ve en el interior del corazón. Me recuerda el viejo dicho: "No juzgues un libro por su portada". Recordamos que Dios siempre toma la decisión correcta y que no necesita mucho con qué trabajar. El Señor elige a los candidatos más improbables e incompetentes en David. Es a través del linaje davídico (real) que Jesús nacerá a la humanidad, lo que representa su realeza.

En la segunda lectura, San Pablo nos recuerda que Cristo es la luz del mundo y que estamos llamados a salir de las tinieblas hacia esta luz tan maravillosa, como hijos de la luz. Durante la primera parte de la Vigilia Pascual, estará oscuro tanto afuera como dentro de la Iglesia. Una vez bendecido y encendido el Cirio Pascual, atravesará la oscuridad; luego, al entrar en procesión, esa luz se compartirá entre los fieles presentes, que llevarán sus propias velas. A medida que la luz se extiende, aunque todavía está oscuro, todas las velas encendidas proporcionan suficiente luz para que podamos ver.

Mientras repasamos las lecturas de la Vigilia Pascual y nos preparamos para el Evangelio, se canta por primera vez el aleluya y se encienden todas las luces de la Iglesia, representando la Luz de Cristo en el mundo. Es un momento poderoso en la liturgia que representa la oscuridad del pecado y la muerte, conquistadas por la Luz de Cristo. Que esa luz siga brillando intensamente en nuestras vidas.

La Buena Nueva del Evangelio es que Jesús lava nuestros pecados y sus consecuencias. La curación del ciego representa cómo el pecado y la oscuridad nos ciegan, y cómo Jesús trae luz y vida y nos permite ver. Vemos no solo con los ojos, sino también con la mente y el corazón. ¡Gracias, Jesús!

¡Santa María, Madre de Dios, ruega por nosotros.
